

## 2019 CIHR-INMHA Brain Star Awards

The Canadian Association for Neuroscience (CAN) and the Canadian Institutes of Health Research's Institute of Neurosciences, Mental Health and Addiction (CIHR-INMHA) are proud to announce the launch of the 2019 Brain Star Award contest.

The CIHR-INMHA Brain Star awards, administered for 2019 by the Canadian Association for Neuroscience, are awarded to students and trainees who have published high impact discoveries in all fields and disciplines covered by CIHR's Institute of Neurosciences, Mental Health and Addiction in the 2019 calendar year.

## Awards

- A maximum of fifteen awards of \$1,500 each are available for 2019
- The top-ranked winner of the Brain Star award will be named the Marlene Reimer Brain Star of the Year.
- Highlights of award recipient's research will be featured on INMHA's and CAN's websites.
- Top three ranked award recipients may be invited to present a summary of their research paper at the Canadian neuroscience meeting.

## Eligibility

The award recipient must

- be a student or a trainee
- have published a research article describing a high impact discovery between January 1 and December 31, 2019
- have done the work described in the paper while working in a laboratory in Canada (university, research centre, teaching hospital or other health organization

Eligibility criteria for all CIHR research funding programs apply.
